

Fluency

Reading fluency is the ability to read text with sufficient accuracy, expression, and automaticity to comprehend what has been read. Reading fluency is a combination of three different skills: rate (how quickly one reads), accuracy (miscues made while reading), and prosody (reading with expression and pausing for punctuation).

"Fluency Phrase & Short Sentence Practice" can be used to practice and monitor fluency. This tool should be used as repeated practice to strengthen fluency skills. Some of the phrases and sentences are taken from the *Fluent Reader* by Timothy Rasinski.

Fluency Phrases and Short Sentences, are included in this resource.

This resource can be used in literacy stations, small group instruction, or for reading intervention.

Fluency

Directions:

To preserve the use of the activity, laminate the fluency phrase or sentence strip. Cut the strips.

The fluency phrases and sentence strips are separated by level. The first set in this resource contains Fry's first 100 words, the second list contains the second 100 words, and the third list contains the third 100 words.

The teacher can start at the level most appropriate for the student. The teacher will show the student a phrase or sentence and the student can read it orally. Once the student is able to read the phrase or sentence quickly and accurately, progress to another phrase or sentence.

The teacher should have the student use the phrases and sentences as repeated reading to practice accuracy and rate.

Extended use of activity:

- Have students partner read the fluency phrases and sentences.**
- Have students put three sentences and phrases together then read quickly and accurately.**
- Have students quickly and accurately read as many phrases and sentences in one minute.**
